Although Wodehouse went on to become more celebrated for his works about Jeeves, Bertie Wooster and Blandings Castle, he retained a keen interest in school stories, and wrote a comical critique on Tom Brown's Schooldays in his collection Tales of St Austin's in 1903 Here, according to Wodehouse's short story, while travelling on a train the
